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Did You Know?

Over 80% of a person's health depends on social determinants of health such as adequate food, housing, income, and relationships with others.

Nearly 100% of Canadians aged 65 and older plan on supporting themselves and living independently and safely in their own homes for as long as possible. Social Prescribing may help achieve that.

What is Social Prescribing? How does it work in the Vulcan Medical Clinic and Community?

Social Prescribing is a holistic, team-based approach to healthcare that bridges the gap between medical and community-based services. In this approach, doctors refer patients through a Link Worker to connect with community-based programs to address the non-medical concerns of patients that may be impacting their health and well-being; such as income, housing, food, transportation and social support. Remember: Social Prescribing is meant to complement your medical health care – not replace it.

What happens when a Social Prescription referral is made? Who is the Link Worker?

If a patient agrees to complete a Social Prescription referral, their health care professional will sign off on the referral and put the patient in touch with the Clinic's Link Worker.
